

The Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS) was conducted in the month of March 2022. The survey was based on questions provided by NAAC (National Assessment and Accreditation Council). The feedback form collected the name, age, gender, class, teacher in-charge, and educational status of parents at the first instance. It was followed by twenty questions with ratings from 0 (zero) to 4 (four) with the latter representing the most positive answer of the questionnaire. The last question allowed the students to write their suggestions and observations. While analysing the data, each question was addressed and total ratings were calculated to arrive at an average feedback given by the student.

Feedback analysis:

A total of 302 students responded to the Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS)sent via email. 264 students responded that 55% and above syllabus was covered in the class. 281 students (93%) felt that the teacher's preparation for the class is either satisfactory or thorough. 291 (96%)students were satisfied with the overall communication skills displayed by teachers. 160 (52%) students described teacher's approach to teaching as excellent; whereas 108 students described it as very good. 269 students (89.07%) opined that the internal evaluation process by the teachers is usually fair. 288 students (95.36%) were satisfied that the assignment performances were discussed with them. 290 students (96.02%) expressed that the institute takes active interest in promoting internship, student exchange, and field visit opportunities for students. 290 (96.02%) students agreed that the teaching and mentoring process in the institution facilitates in cognitive, social and emotional growth. 294 students (97.35%) felt that the institution provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow. 291 (96%) students expressed that teachers inform about your expected competencies, course outcomes and programme outcomes. 295 students (97.68%) expressed that their mentor does a necessary follow-up with an assigned task to you. 297 students (98.34%) felt that the teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications. 294 students (97.35%) opined that the teachers identified their strengths and encouraged them. 290 students (96.02%) felt that the institution makes effort to engage students in the monitoring review and continuous quality improvement of the teaching learning process. 290 students (96.02%) expressed that the institute /teachers use student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies for enhancing leaning experiences. 291 students (96%) felt that the teachers encouraged them to participate in extracurricular activities.289 (95.69%) students agreed that efforts are made by the institute/teachers to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills to make you ready for the world of work. 286 students (94.70%) felt that the percentage of teachers using ICT tools such as








4. The teacher's approach to teaching can be best be described as? (Rating scale: 4-Excellent 3-Very good 2-Good 1- Fair 0-Poor)
